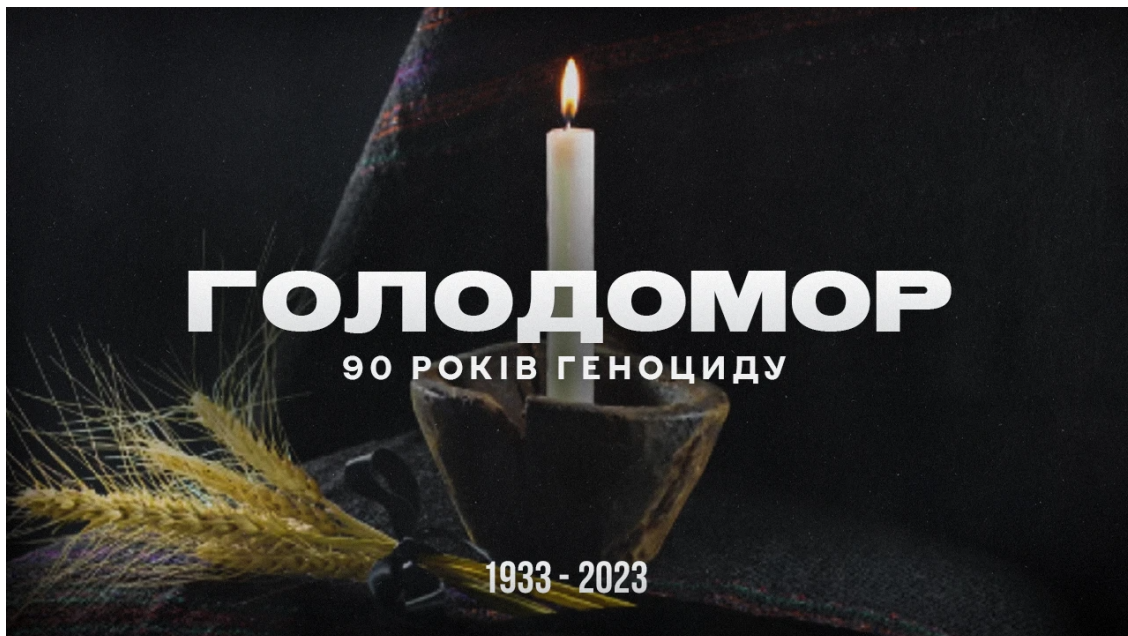

On [Saturday, 18 November](#), the Ukrainian American community in New York will honor the innocent victims of the Holodomor, Stalin's 1932-1933

Famine Genocide in Ukraine. Beginning at 10:30am, participants will gather at St. George Ukrainian Catholic Church (at 30 East 7th Street) for a solemn procession up 3rd Avenue. The Memorial March will end at St. Patrick's Cathedral, where a requiem service sung by the Ukrainian Chorus Dumka of New York will take place beginning at 1:00pm.

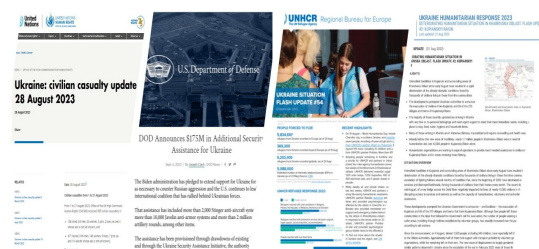
